HON. UNION HOME MINISTER, SHRI AMIT SHAH LAYS FOUNDATION STONE OF NFSU CAMPUS IN TRIPURA



On 8th March 2022, Hon'ble Union Minister of Home Affairs and Minister of Cooperation, Shri Amit Shah, laid the foundation stone for the new Campus of NFSU in Tripura. He performed Bhoomi Pujan and Shilanyas for the permanent campus at Srinagar, West Tripura and inaugurated a temporary campus made ready at Agartala in West Tripura. The events were attended by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tripura, Shri Biplab Kumar Deb; Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister of Tripura, Shri Jishnu Dev Varma; Hon'ble Union Minister of State for Social Justice and Empowerment, Km. Pratima Bhaumik, and other senior ministers of Tripura State. Union Home Secretary, Shri Ajay Kumar Bhalla IAS; Chief Secretary of Tripura, Shri Kumar Alok IAS; Joint Secretary in the Ministry of Home Affairs Shri Shyamal Mishra IAS, and many other dignitaries also attended the event. All the dignitaries were received by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of NFSU, Dr. J.M. Vyas. He was accompanied by the Campus Director of NFSU's Gujarat Campus, Prof. (Dr.) S.O. Junare, Executive Registrar of NFSU, Shri C.D. Jadeja and Campus Director of NFSU's Tripura Campus, Dr. Hemant K. Pratihari who were instrumental in overseeing all the arrangements.



















After performing pooja on a 50-acre plot (49.21 acres) allotted to NFSU at Srinagar in West Tripura's Anandnagar, the next event began with Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tripura, Shri Biplab Kumar Deb welcoming all the dignitaries and thanking Shri Amit Shah for bringing the first-ever Forensic Sciences campus in the North-East. He called it a historic event as the institution is going to bring revolutionary changes in the State with an investment of Rs. 250 to 300 Crores in next five years. Addressing a gathering, Shri Amit Shah expressed happiness at the launch of the first-ever National Forensic Sciences University campus in the North-East India. He mentioned that this university has been upgraded as a national university so that the opportunity and benefits of studying these subjects is made available in all the States. He said that today when we are fighting extremism and infiltration, and are facing problems of narcotics and cyber attacks, establishment of a NFSU Campus here holds great importance. Courses for undergraduates and post graduates in Drone Forensics, DNA Finger Printing, Wild-life Forensics, Counterfeiting Investigation, Cyber Crime, Narcotics Forensics, Drug Analysis Science, Criminology, Forensic Food Investigation, and Homeland Security will be conducted here. Not just the students but the faculty to teach these subjects will also pass out from this institution. He said that after four to five years, 3000 to 4000 students would be making their future here and this entire area will get developed. In turn, the entire North East will be hugely benefitted. In the end, he conveyed his good wishes to all the aspiring students of this campus and hoped that they all will be able to avail the expert training which will be imparted by NFSU. His address was followed by a short talk by Dr. J.M. Vyas where he profusely thanked the Hon'ble Union Home Minister for setting up a campus in Tripura. He brought out the positive outlook of Shri Amit Shah as witnessed just now, and informed that at the very outset itself, the Hon'ble Minister had told him that a campus in Tripura has to be established. In the end, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, once again thanked Shri Amit Shah for providing an opportunity to set-up a world-class campus of NFSU, as also expressed gratitude to the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Hon'ble Union Minister of State for Social Justice and Empowerment, all the dignitaries and everyone for their support. The function was attended by local citizens from different fields and students, maintaining strict COVID-19 protocol.

NFSU CO-HOSTS COLOMBO SECURITY CONCLAVE: VIRTUAL WORKSHOP ON REGIONAL CYBER SECURITY CAPABILITIES







The Colombo Security Conclave, a first-ever virtual workshop on "Developing Regional Cyber Security Capabilities on Defensive operations, Deep/Dark web Handling and Digital Forensics" was hosted by National Security Council Secretariat (NSCS) in association with NFSU and Secretariat of Colombo Security Conclave on 10th-11th January, 2022. The Colombo Security Conclave was organized in coordination with India, Sri Lanka, Maldives, Seychelles, Mauritius and Bangladesh. Considering that the global cyber security threat landscape has grown complex with the use of sophisticated offensive tools and technologies by the cybercriminals and non-state actors, there has been a significant rise in the demand of smart Cyber Threat Intelligence Systems (CTIS), Security Information and Event Management Solutions (SIEMS), Artificial Intelligence based Security Operation Centres(SOC) and Next Generation Threat Intelligence Systems (NGTIS). In the light of this, the conclave deliberated upon topics such as Deep Web and Dark Net Investigation and Challenges; Digital Forensics; Cyber Threat Intelligence; and, Defensive Operations in Cyber Domain. The aim was to develop solutions by understanding common Cyber Security and Digital Forensic Challenges for effective and efficient coordination among CSC countries, as also to enhance capability of Law Enforcement and Government agencies in criminal cases involving dark web and digital evidence by creating Cyber Security and Digital forensic experts. India's Liaison Team for the CSC comprised Ms. Ashima Chaturvedi, Director, National Security Council Secretariat, India and Prof. (Dr.) Naveen Kumar Chaudhary, Dean, School of Cyber Security & Digital Forensics of NFSU. The workshop commenced with the opening address by Lt Gen Rajesh Pant (Retd.), National Cyber Security Coordinator, National Security Council Secretariat, India, followed by Shri Vikram Misri, Deputy National Security Advisor, India. The dignitaries invited to chair various sessions during the workshop were Shri Sanjay Sahay IPS (Retd.), Founder Director of TechConPro Pvt ltd (Session: Deep web and Dark net Investigation and Challenges), Major General J.R. Kulathunga (Retd), Chief of National Intelligence, Ministry of Defence, Sri Lanka (Session: Digital Forensics: A Way Ahead), Dr. J.M. Vyas, Vice Chancellor, NFSU, India (Session: Cyber Threat Intelligence), and Rear Admiral Mohit Gupta, Director General, Defence Cyber Agency (Session: Defensive Operations in Cyber Domain). Prof. (Dr.) Naveen Kumar Chaudhary was invited as a Keynote speaker to present on the topic of Digital Forensics, it's challenges & solutions. Overall, the workshop discussed the research challenges, approaches, and roadmaps in the areas of cyber security and digital forensics.

DR. J.M. VYAS SHOWS PATH TO DIGITAL TEACHER AND VIRTUAL LABS







Digital technology has an important role in delivering quality education to the students. The digital thrust in education addresses some of the major challenges, like the lack of well trained teachers, the need for updated curriculum, modern methods of pedagogy, and outcome-based learnings, as envisaged in NEP 2020.

In the light of this, a webinar on 'Implementation of Budget 2022 for the Education Sector' was organized to explore ways of achieving Atmanirbhar Bharat through the Amrit Mantra of Digital Education and Dynamic Skilling on 21st February 2022. Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi kick started this webinar by emphasising on five aspects related to the education sector - universalisation of quality education, skill development, urban planning and design, internationalisation and AVGC (Animation, Visual Effects, Gaming and Comic). He informed that e-Vidya, One Class-One Channel, Digital Labs and Digital University are going to help the youth a lot, especially the National Digital University. In a session on the theme, "The Digital Teacher-Creating Quality e-content and Virtual Labs for Inclusivity, Better Learning Outcomes and Skilling", the Honorable Vice Chancellor of NFSU, Dr. J. M. Vyas, was invited to share his expert views. Being a veteran in the fields of technology exploitation as well as education, he put up a strong case for a Virtual Lab for Digital Learning. He explained the importance of Digital Teacher and its linkages with Virtual Labs, and highlighted the objectives and the need for Virtual Labs, Virtual Assessment Platforms, development of Augmented and Virtual Reality based futuristic labs, and Sign Based Learning Virtual Labs for students with hearing impairments. In all, the address by Dr. Vyas was a revelation in the future education scenario of India.

NFSU'S CYBER DEFENCE CENTRE BECOMES FIRST ISO CERTIFIED LAB IN INDIA







The Cyber Defence Center (CDC) of NFSU has become the first-ever ISO/IEC 27001 certified laboratory in India with UKAS and NABCB accreditation. The CDC is a unique setup where cutting edge tools and technologies are integrated on a single platform to provide teaching, training, consultancy and research facilities. The two important Cyber verticals - Operational Technology (OT) and Internet of Things (IoT) are recently integrated on the existing platform. At CDC, while students of higher education are given practical hands-on training, it also offers a wide range of special training to government officers, police and cyber security experts from more than 60 countries. Besides the coveted certification for the CDC, certain faculty members have also been certified as ISO / IEC 17025 and 27037 who are providing advanced forensic investigation support to some of the most prestigious investigating agencies. These are Prof. (Dr.) Naveen Kumar Chaudhary, Dr. Digvijaysinh Rathod, Dr. Nilay Mistry, Mr. Dharmesh Dave, Mr. Sarang Rajvansh, Mr. Raihan Patel, Mr. Ramya Shah, Mr. Kritarth Jhala and Mr. Darsh Patel, all from SCSDF. The formal certificate was presented by Shri Ram Kumar Sharma, G.M., Central-West Region of Bureau Veritas Certification Holding SAS, United Kingdom, to the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Dr. J.M. Vyas who in turn handed it over to Dr. Chaudhary. The Hon'ble V.C. expressed happiness on the achievement and complemented the entire team of CDC for the sustained hard work as well as constant effort to improve the capability of the centre. A 6-day 'International Conference on Counter Terrorism' was organised by Global Counter Terrorism Council (GCTC), an international Think Tank, and NFSU from 17th January to 22nd January 2022 on a virtual platform. The Conference dealt with every possible challenge of terrorism such as nature of terror in every sub-continent, terror funding, narcotics network, intelligence, WMD & CBRN, lone wolf, drone & anti-drone, emerging technologies, media, terror psychology, radicalisation, and role of Homeland Security. The conference witnessed more than 200 speakers and delegates from around 50 countries. Dr. J.M. Vyas, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, was invited to deliver a Keynote Address. In his Inaugural Keynote Address, he apprised the delegates about the role played by forensic sciences in combating terrorism, highlighting various types of terror acts and the way different techniques of forensics are applied in its investigation. During the conference, number of NFSU faculty members were also invited to participate. In the inaugural session on 17th January, 2022, Air Commodore KR Thaakar, Dean, School of Police Science & Security Studies (SPSSS) of NFSU, participated in a discussion on 'Global Terror Threats, Challenges & Response'. Air Commodore Kedar Thaakar also participated in another discussion held on 19 Jan 2022 on the topic 'Changing Dynamics of Terrorism in Kashmir'. In a discussion conducted on 'Global Narcotics Network - Threats, Challenges & Responses' on 20 Jan 2022, Dr. Astha Pandey, Associate Professor & Head of NFSU's Centre of Excellence for NDPS, participated along with experts from police, media and academia. Group Captain Ajay Purandare, Head, Centre for Futuristic Defence Studies, participated in a discussion on 'UAV, UCAV & UAS: Threats and Countermeasures' on 21 Jan 2022 where he was joined by other experts. On 21 January 2021, a discussion was held on 'Emerging Technologies & Methodologies' in which Prof. (Dr.) Naveen Kumar Chaudhary, Dean, School of Cyber Security & Digital Forensics (SCSDF) and Dr. Akshay Pottathil, Adjunct Faculty of NFSU and President, IRI, USA participated along with experts from India, USA, Italy, Australia and Switzerland. On the same day, Dr. Akshay Pottathil participated in another discussion on 'Enhancing Counter-Terrorism capabilities through Training' along with other experts. Dr. Priyanka Kacker, Senior Assistant Professor, School of Forensic Psychology, participated in a discussion on 'The Sociology and Psychology of Violent Extremism' on 22 Jan 2022. In another discussion conducted on the same day on 'Assessing radicalization and Counter radicalization Programmes', Dr. Pavithran Nambiar, Senior faculty of SPSSS, participated. On culmination of the conference on 22nd January 2022, Dr. J.M. Vyas was once again invited to deliver his concluding remarks where he appreciated the effort put in by GCTC, especially by Shri Aditya Tikoo, the Founder Convener of GCTC, in organising this conference and getting so many expert speakers from across the world. FROM THE FREEDOM MOVEMENT...

SHYAMJI KRISHNA VARMA – THE MAN WHO TOOK THE FIGHT TO BRITISH SOIL









During the British reign over India of over two hundred years, they ruthlessly exploited India's economic resources and mercilessly oppressed the people. In response, many individuals took on the might of the British to free India. But there was one indefatigable freedom fighter in Shyamji Krishna Varma who chose to take this fight to British soil, running it from his base at London and later from Paris and Geneva. Shyamji Krishna Varma was a Kutchi by birth, Arya Samajist by faith, and a revolutionary by choice.

Shyamji Krishna Varma (4 October 1857 – 30 March 1930) arrived in England in 1899 and became the unquestioned leader of all the young men and revolutionaries who were then fighting for our national freedom. In 1905, Shyamji focused his activity for the complete independence of India. He began by launching a English monthly, The Indian Sociologist, aimed at inspiring mass opposition to British rule. On 18 February 1905, Shyamji inaugurated a new organisation called, 'The Indian Home Rule Society' with the object of securing Home Rule for India, and carrying on propaganda in England to attain the same.

Shyamaji Krishna Verma instituted several scholarships and fellowships to attract outstanding Indian students to study in England but on one condition that they would not accept any service under the British government. He also founded 'India House' as a hostel for 25 Indian students as well as to facilitate his activities. It was inaugurated on 1st July 1905 in the presence of Dadabhai Naoroji, Lala Lajpat Rai, Madam Cama, etc. The India House and The Indian Sociologist rapidly developed as an organised meeting point for radical nationalists among Indian students in Britain. Shyamji Krishna Verma raised strong protests against the British rule in India by publishing pamphlets, writing books and delivering speeches. He was visited at the house by a vast number of social thinkers and revolutionaries, including Lenin and Gandhiji (then working as a lawyer). Soon Shyamji's activities in England aroused the concern of the British government. In 1905 he was barred from practising law by the Inner Temple following charges of sedition. His movements were closely watched by the British secret service, and so he decided to shift secretly to Paris, leaving India House in charge of Vir Savarkar. The British government tried to have him extradited from France without success as he gained the support of many top French politicians. Shyamji's work in Paris helped gain support for Indian Independence from European countries. He agitated for the release of Savarker and acquired great support all over Europe and Russia. After the outbreak of WW-I, he moved to Geneva in Switzerland and spent the rest of his life till he died in 1930. News of his death was suppressed by the British colonial government in India. Nevertheless, tributes were paid to him by Bhagat Singh and other inmates in Lahore Jail.

He had made prepaid arrangements with the local government of Geneva and St Georges cemetery to preserve his and his wife's ashes for 100 years and to send their urns to India whenever it became independent. Finally on 22 August 2003, the then Hon'ble Chief Minister of Gujarat, Shri Narendra Modi covered himself with glory by bringing back the urns containing the ashes, 55 years after Indian Independence. A memorial called Kranti Teerth dedicated to him was built and inaugurated in 2010 near Mandvi. A new town has been developed in his native state of Kutch and named after him as Shyamji Krishna Varma Nagar. In 1909, Shyamji Krishna Verma was debarred from the Inner Temple. More than a century later, this decision was revisited by the Inner Temple in 2015, and a unanimous decision taken to posthumously reinstate him after the Inn's Governing Council noted that Varma "did not receive an entirely fair hearing". During his visit to the U.K. in 2015, Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi personally received his reinstatement certificate at the Inner Temple.

Shyamaji Krishna Verma had raised the voice of India for Independence in the last decade of the 19th century, more than 25 years before the arrival of Gandhiji on the Indian scene. In fact, even the idea of Satyagraha came from him much before Gandhiji developed it into political action. There is no doubt that it was Shyamji who first advocated non-violent means of getting rid of the British and using withdrawal of cooperation as the most effective weapon for this purpose. Shyamji Krishna Varma was one of the foremost freedom fighters in the history of the freedom movement of India. It is time, the younger generation knows about such unsung heroes and gets inspired from his contribution.
