

# EXPERTS' TALK

## AMLTECH: LEVERAGING TECHNOLOGY AGAINST FINANCIAL CRIMES

The School of Management Studies, NFSU Delhi Campus, successfully conducted a workshop titled “AMLTech: Leveraging Technology Against Financial Crimes” on August 28, 2025. This initiative was a reflection of the University's ongoing commitment to bridge the gap between academia and the industry, by preparing future professionals to tackle emerging global challenges in Financial Crime Detection and Prevention.

The workshop featured illuminating sessions led by seasoned industry professionals from the United States of America (USA), Mr. Rajarshi Roy, Mr. Chakradhar Yedurupaka and Mr. Vikas Chikurthi, who brought a wealth of real-world insights into the complexities of anti-money laundering (AML) technologies.

Discussions revolved around the critical role of artificial intelligence, compliance mechanisms and tech-driven innovation in building resilient financial systems. Students and faculty alike gained valuable exposure to cutting-edge practices, global compliance trends and the transformative power of AI in Financial Crime Analytics.



## INTEGRATING NEUROSCIENCE AND PSYCHOLOGY: ADVANCES IN NEUROIMAGING APPLICATIONS

An engaging expert session on “Neuroimaging Techniques and Applications in Forensic and Clinical Psychology” was conducted by Mr. Chetan Mukundan, offering deep insights into the fascinating intersection of neuroscience, psychology and forensic science. The session explored various neuroimaging tools and their practical applications in understanding human behavior, mental processes and criminal cognition. The interactive discussion enriched students' academic perspectives and emphasized the growing importance of neuropsychological research in forensic investigations and clinical assessments.

The sessions focused on “How to Make Institutions Safer for Children” and “Well-being Interventions with an Emphasis on Inclusion.” The workshop offered valuable insights into preventive strategies, inclusive practices, and policy-oriented approaches to ensure safer and more supportive environments for children.



## GUEST LECTURE ON PSYCHOTHERAPY AND COUNSELLING MODALITIES

On 18th September, MSc Clinical Psychology (Semester 3) students attended an insightful guest lecture organized by Ms. Nishtha Grover. The session was conducted by Ms. Shiron Samuel, Clinical Psychologist at St. Stephen's Hospital, who shared her expertise on psychotherapy and various modalities of counselling.

The interactive discussion enriched students' understanding of therapeutic approaches, emphasizing the importance of empathy, ethics, and adaptability in clinical practice.

In this thought-provoking session, Ms. Chauhan encouraged students to move beyond conventional career thinking and explore the art of effective problem-solving and critical thinking which are key Life-Skills given by WHO, through entrepreneurship. She discussed how identifying real-world gaps can evolve into impactful start-up ideas and highlighted the growing role of Cybersecurity, AI and Blockchain Management in reshaping the start-up ecosystem. Students were introduced to key entrepreneurial tools, such as developing a Minimum Viable Product (MVP), crafting effective go-to-market strategies and navigating funding models and scaling challenges.

The session addressed the growing relevance of drone technology across civil and defence sectors, with a particular emphasis on the critical need for robust security frameworks to counter the evolving threats posed by unmanned aerial systems. Air Cmde Gaekwad provided an in-depth exploration of forensic techniques related to drone data extraction, flight log analysis, payload inspection and the tracing of UAV origins, demonstrating how drone forensics is increasingly integral to incident response, criminal investigations and cybercrime cases involving aerial platforms.



## HANDS-ON EXPERT SESSION ON BLOCKCHAIN SECURITY AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT

The School of Cyber Security and Digital Forensics organized a two-day expert-led program on September 22-23, 2025, featuring Mr. Satyam Chakravarty, Strategic Advisor to Tiktern and Meriskill.

With over 25 years of professional experience and leadership across three startups, Mr. Chakravarty delivered an insightful and highly engaging session for the students.

Day 1 focused on Blockchain Security and Cryptocurrency, where students explored the fundamentals of blockchain, its architecture, smart contracts, tokenisation and Blockchain Forensics. The session provided hands-on exposure to emerging Blockchain technologies and their security challenges.

Day 2 addressed Career Preparation in a fast-changing world, guiding students on how to navigate the evolving job market. Mr. Chakravarty shared valuable advice on building a successful career, identifying opportunities in the cybersecurity and tech ecosystem and developing essential professional skills.




## DECODING GOVERNANCE: A FRAMEWORK FOR FINANCIAL SYSTEM & TAXATION

### SPECIAL LECTURE ON LEGISLATIVE DRAFTING BY DR. R.J.R. KASIBHATLA

The School of Law, Forensic Justice and Policy Studies (SLFJPS) organized a special lecture for students of B.B.A.; LL.B. (Hons.), Semester VII on the topic of Legislative Drafting. The session was conducted by Dr. R.J.R. Kasibhatla, Joint Secretary, Department of Legal Affairs, Ministry of Law and Justice, Government of India.



The lecture explored the legislative process, covering the meaning, stages and objectives of legislation, along with the principles and practices of Legislative Drafting. Dr. Kasibhatla offered deep insights into drafting constitutional provisions, the responsibilities of a draftsman and the elements that must be considered when translating legal intent into legislative text.

### INDUSTRY TRENDS IN FORENSIC ACCOUNTING & FRAUD INVESTIGATION

The School of Management Studies, NFSU Delhi Campus, hosted an enlightening industry expert session on “Industry Trends in Forensic Accounting & Fraud Investigation” on September 29, 2025.

The session was conducted by Mr. Vivaan Talwar, Senior Consultant at Grant Thornton, who brought with him an immense amount of field experience and field-level insights into the evolving world of Financial Investigations.



Mr. Talwar delved into the latest trends in Fraud Detection and Forensic Accounting, highlighting real-world methodologies currently used across global investigative practices. The session offered students the opportunity of an hands-on experience to learn Forensic Techniques and Analytical Tools employed in uncovering financial irregularities and Corporate Fraud.



### INDUSTRY EXPERT SESSION ON “FRAUD RISK ASSESSMENT FOR BUSINESS”

The School of Management Studies, NFSU Delhi, hosted an insightful industry-level Expert Session on “Fraud Risk Assessment for Business” on September 29, 2025, featuring Mr. Sharad Kumar Saxena as the Guest Speaker. With rich industry experience, Mr. Saxena provided students with practical perspectives on Fraud Risk Management, Forensic Accounting Practices, and blending the academic learnings with field-level application of the Certified Forensic Accountant (CrFA) certification.



The session delved into how businesses can proactively identify vulnerabilities and implement effective controls to safeguard against financial irregularities. Drawing connections between academic learning and professional application, Mr. Saxena’s discussion enriched students’ understanding of organizational risk management, regulatory compliance and real-world Financial Crime investigations.

# TRAININGS IMPARTED

## STRENGTHENING LAW ENFORCEMENT: EVIDENCE-BASED POLICING UNDER NEW CRIMINAL LAWS

The 9th course on Evidence-Based Policing: New Criminal Laws, held from July 1-3, 2025, brought together judges, magistrates, senior police officers, prosecutors and correctional administrators for an intensive 3-day training. The course focused on the implementation of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam (BSA) and Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), highlighting evidence-based and data-driven policing practices. Sessions on Psychological Autopsy and Crime Scene Investigation, Information Technology in Policing, GIS and Crime Mapping and Policy Reforms enhanced participants' professional understanding and practical expertise.

## BRIDGING FORENSICS AND LAW ENFORCEMENT: DANIPS OFFICERS' ORIENTATION VISIT

Officers of the Delhi, Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Lakshadweep, Daman and Diu and Dadra and Nagar Haveli Police Service (DANIPS) visited the campus on July 3, 2025, for an orientation program across various divisions of forensic sciences. They explored the role of forensic technology in criminal justice and engaged in interactive discussions with faculty. Prof. (Dr.) Minakshi Sinha, Deputy Director (Training), addressed the officers and emphasized the importance of technology-driven law enforcement. The visit was coordinated by Dr. Mohammed Subhan Attar and Dr. Neha Tomar.

## ENHANCING EXPERTISE: COURSE ON INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION UNDER NDPS ACT

The 2nd Course on 'Investigation and Prosecution under NDPS Act and Application' was organized from July 14-16, 2025, under the guidance of Prof. (Dr.) Purvi Pokhariyal, Campus Director, NFSU, Delhi Campus. Coordinated by Dr. Hunny Matiyani and Dr. Akansha Pandey, the training provided in-depth understanding of the NDPS Act, its amendments and procedural aspects of drug-related offenses. Sessions covered identification of narcotic substances, search and seizure protocols, digital forensics and the role of forensic psychology in investigations, enriching the professional acumen of judges, prosecutors and forensic officers.

## ADVANCING KNOWLEDGE: TRAINING COURSE ON NEW CRIMINAL LAWS AND JUSTICE APPLICATIONS

A five-day training course on "New Criminal Laws: Applications in the Criminal Justice Process" was organized from July 28 - August 1, 2025, bringing together judicial officers, prosecutors, jail superintendents, forensic scientists and IAF officers from across India. The sessions covered new offenses under BNS, offenses against women and transgender persons, the role of police in investigation under BNSS and admissibility of electronic evidence. Participants also visited the National Crime Records Bureau and Forensic Science Laboratory, Delhi for practical exposure. The course was inaugurated and concluded by Prof. (Dr.) Minakshi Sinha and coordinated by Dr. Somabha Bandopadhyay and Mr. Shikhar Gupta, under the mentorship of Prof. (Dr.) Purvi Pokhariyal.

## 6TH COURSE ON “EMERGING TRENDS IN BANK & CORPORATE FRAUDS AND THEIR DETECTION INCLUDING ONLINE FRAUDS

The National Forensic Sciences University, Delhi Campus successfully concluded the 6th Course on “Emerging Trends in Bank & Corporate Frauds and Their Detection



Including Online Frauds”, a 3-day intensive program aimed at deepening professional understanding of the ever-evolving Financial Crime landscape. The course brought together a diverse cohort of experts, investigators, financial professionals and scholars, offering focused discussions on fraud detection techniques, investigative tools, digital evidence handling, and preventive strategies.

## VERTICAL INTERACTION COURSE ON CYBER CRIME INVESTIGATION & DIGITAL FORENSICS CONCLUDES SUCCESSFULLY AT NFSU DELHI



The School of Cyber Security and Digital Forensics successfully conducted the Vertical Interaction Course on Cyber Crime Investigation & Digital Forensics from September 22-26, 2025, sponsored by the Bureau of Police Research and Development (BPR&D). The 5-day program served as a vital platform for synergy between law enforcement personnel and forensic experts, fostering deeper understanding and skill-building in the realm of cybercrime and digital evidence.

Special emphasis was placed on the procedural and jurisdictional challenges arising from cloud-based and transnational cybercrimes. Participants also benefited from field visits to the Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL), New Delhi, and the Intelligence Fusion and Strategic Operations (IFSO) Unit of Delhi Police, gaining hands-on exposure to inter-agency operations and field-based forensic workflows.



The inaugural session was graced by Prof. (Dr.) Purvi Pokhriyal, Campus Director, and Prof. (Dr.) Minakshi Sinha, Deputy Director, with a compelling inaugural address delivered by Dr. Ravi Joseph Lokku, IPS, ADGP, BPR&D, who shed light on the evolving landscape of cybercrime and the pressing need for forensic innovation. Throughout the week, participants engaged in expert-led sessions on cutting-edge topics such as digital evidence preservation, disk forensics, deepfake detection, AI integration in investigations, mobile phone forensics, OSINT, and banking fraud analytics.



## VISIT OF CBI OFFICERS TO NFSU DELHI CAMPUS



A team of 144 CBI Officers visited the LNJP NICFS – NFSU Delhi Campus on 25 and 28 August 2025 as part of an institutional familiarisation programme with the University's divisions and laboratories.



## NCC CADETS RALLY FOR A CAUSE ON INTERNATIONAL YOUTH DAY


