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
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### **Deeksharambh**

### 18th International Symposium on Victimology



The 18th International Symposium of the World Society of Victimology (WSV), themed "Forensic and Contemporary Perspectives in Victimology and Victim Assistance," was hosted by the National Forensic Sciences University (NFSU). Esteemed guests included Prof. Janice Joseph, President of WSV and Distinguished Professor at Stockton University, and Vice Chancellor of NFSU and Padma Shri awardee Dr. J.M. Vyas, among others. The event commenced with a traditional lamp-lighting ceremony and a series of speeches. Dr. Janice Joseph highlighted the significance of the symposium and proposed the need for a certificate program on Victimology. Dr. J.M. Vyas discussed the deeper aspects of victimhood, while Justice Jitendra Kumar Maheshwari emphasized a victim-centric justice approach, stressing that the innocent must never suffer wrongful punishment. The symposium also featured Professor Dawn Beichner and Professor Said Gulyamov, who spoke on gender studies and the importance of cyber law in the modern world. Ambassador Dambajavyn Ganbold from Mongolia briefly discussed India-Mongolia relations. This marked the first time India hosted this prestigious event, further establishing NFSU as a global leader in forensic and victimology education.

The second day of the Symposium continued with a focus on various dimensions of victimology, featuring keynote speakers and thematic panels. Prof. Dawn Beichner chaired the morning plenary, where Mr. Michael O'Connell, Consulting Victimologist, spoke about the pivotal role of independent ombuds persons in protecting victims' rights and empowering crime victims. Key discussions included an Asian Perspective on Victimology, where Prof. (Dr.) Purvi Pokhariyal addressed Indian jurisprudence on victim sciences, and Prof. Said Gulyamov presented a comparative analysis of victim protection in Uzbekistan. Panels throughout the day explored topics such as Victims and the Criminal Justice System, Spiritual Victimology, and Victimization and Abuse of Power. In the Green Victimology session, discussions focused on the impact of environmental crimes. In the afternoon, panels highlighted wrongful convictions, human trafficking, and sexual victimization. Presenters shared insights on topics such as child abuse, domestic violence, and the challenges faced by transgender victims. The day concluded with an in-depth examination of Victim Experiences of Crime and Justice and forensic approaches to victimology, offering comprehensive perspectives on victim protection and recovery.









The Symposium 2024 continued its enlightening discussions on Day 4, featuring a series of impactful sessions focused on victimization and justice. The day commenced in the Upper Auditorium with a plenary session led by Dr. Mangai Natarajan from The City University of New York. Her presentation, titled "Understanding the Impact of Covid-19 Pandemic on Domestic Violence Victims and Survivors: Lessons Learned, " shed light on the profound effects of the pandemic on vulnerable populations. Following this, attendees participated in several panels addressing various aspects of victimology. Mr. Michael O'Connell chaired a panel on "Forensic Profiling of Emotional Abuse Victims in Marriages, " emphasizing the importance of a victim-centric approach within the criminal justice system. Concurrently, panels in the IRD building explored topics such as "Victim-Centric Forensic Approaches" and "Victimization of Children, " chaired by Dr. Gaurav Jhadav and Prof. Beulah Shekhar, respectively. The afternoon sessions featured critical discussions on scientific evidence in criminal trials and the silent victims of violence, highlighting ongoing challenges in addressing victimization. Overall, Day 4 of Symposium 2024 reinforced the importance of understanding and supporting victims within the justice system. As the symposium wrapped up, it left an enduring call to action for all stakeholders to prioritize victim rights and cultivate a more compassionate justice system.



Day 3 featured a powerful lineup of speakers and panels dedicated to exploring the complex issues surrounding victimization. The day began in the Upper Auditorium with a thoughtprovoking plenary session led by Dr. Sunitha Krishnan, a Padma Shri Awardee and cofounder of Prajwala. Her presentation, "The Journey of Trafficked Victims – Healing and Prosecution, " focused on three poignant cases of sex trafficking, highlighting the psychological, physical, and social challenges faced by victims, particularly those driven into trafficking by financial hardships. Mr. Michael O'Connell chaired the subsequent panel on "Global Perspective on Challenges in Teaching and Research in Green Victimology, " emphasizing the need for innovative approaches in the field. Afternoon sessions included discussions on "Coping with Victimization" and "Victimization and Education, both aimed at identifying strategies for better support systems for victims. In the Lower Auditorium, Prof. Dr. Nirmal Kanti Chakrabarti chaired a session on "Victim Assistance: Comparative Strategies and Schemes, "while Prof. Dawn Beichner-Thomas led a panel on "Current Issues in Victim Assistance." The day concluded with panels addressing Green Victimology and media's role in victimization, underscoring the multifaceted nature of victimology and the ongoing need for dialogue and action in this critical field.





# Training on Forensic Science Approaches in New Criminal Laws



Under the initiative of the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, and with the esteemed guidance of Padma Shri Awardee Dr. J. M. Vyas, Vice Chancellor of the National Forensic Sciences University (NFSU), the School of Law, Forensic Justice & Policy Studies at NFSU, Gandhinagar, is dedicated to enhancing the justice ecosystem. This is being achieved by providing training to over 5,000 forensic scientists on the latest developments in criminal law.

NFSU has successfully interacted with Forensic Science officials from all across India since previous year to acquaint them with the changes in new criminal laws from forensic science point of view. Prof. Dr. Purvi Pokhariyal, along with the faculties of School of Law, Forensic Justice & Policy Studies at the NFSU, Gandhinagar has contributed towards training and holistic understanding of new criminal laws.





The National Forensic Sciences University, Gandhinagar, organized a series of training programs on Forensic Science Approaches in New Criminal Laws. The sessions offered valuable insights into the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita, Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita, and Bhartiya Sakshya Adhiniyam, with lectures delivered by distinguished legal experts.

The training focused on the revamping of substantive criminal law in India, providing an in-depth understanding of new offenses and punishments introduced under the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita. Additionally, the participants explored forensic science approaches in relation to these new criminal laws.

Trainees were provided extensive reading materials, including a Capsule Course on Forensic Science Approaches in New Criminal Laws. Key topics included the Comparative Forensic Legal Framework of the Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita and the forensic evidence handling and investigative procedures under the Bhartiya Sakshya Adhiniyam.

Discussions also covered critical issues such as Crime Scene Management: Legal Issues and Challenges, offering practical insights into the complexities involved. Each session concluded with mock trials and courtroom testimony exercises, followed by a quiz and feedback session to reinforce the learning experience.

These training programs represent a significant step towards strengthening forensic science practices in the context of new criminal laws in India.



## **Nyayamitra Initiative**

Assurance of Legal Assistance in order to mitigate any adverse circumstance is of paramount importance and the same should be accessible by every citizen. Following the legacy premised on Article 39A of the Indian Constitution, the School of Law, Forensic Justice and Policy Studies, National Forensic Sciences University through its Pro Bono Club and Legal Assistance Cell introduces Nyayamitra which is an exclusive forum that pertinently provides legal assistance within the university to all the students and assure them with speedy redressal of their complaints. The concept and idea of Nyayamitra is inspired by the legal assistance arms of the Ministry of Law and Justice, which are Nyayabandhu and Tele Law, which assures access to justice in the corners of society. The inaugural event for Nyayamitra was held on 18th September 2024 The Event was honoured by the presence of Ms. Zeal Shah, Advocate and Founder of Sahay NGO and Prof. (Dr.) Pruvi Pokhariyal, Dean, School of Law Forensic Justice and Policy Studies, National Forensic Sciences University who graced the event virtually.

The major objective of Nyayamitra is to promulgate legal assistance throughout the NFSU campus so that any student or any other person within the university who needs legal assistance can approach the cell to secure their rights. With this noble thought of expanding the ambit of justice, Nyayamitra brings in-house legal counselling for NFSU. The Inaugural Event inculcated various chains of events encompassing a Street Play (Nukkad Natak), which was based on the subject of the 'Right to Choose' and empathetically portraying the lacuna of a system where choices of citizens are explicitly undermined, and a citizen under political crunch is unable to raise his voice. The event also included a panel discussion by Ms. Zeal Shah, Dr. Gaurav Jadhav, and Dr. Bishwa Kallyan Dash on the topics pertinent to uplifting the principles governing access to justice.





### **Corporate Spectrum 2.0**



Corporate Spectrum 2.0 was organized to provide corporate law students and professionals with in-depth insights into key areas such as insolvency, arbitration, and data privacy. This event featured distinguished speakers from leading law firms and the corporate sector, offering participants a chance to engage in discussions on pressing legal issues. The event began with the introduction and felicitation of three keynote speakers done by Dr. Bishwa Kallyan Dash, Dr. Gaurav Jadhav and Dr. Dipankar, followed by informative discussions. In the first session, Ms. Surbhi Pareek, an expert in insolvency and restructuring, discussed the practical applications of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC). She spoke on the role of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (IBBI) in corporate restructuring, offering real-world insights into managing insolvency in India. The session was highly interactive and gave the students an understanding of the importance of legal frameworks in handling corporate crises. Following this, Mr. Alok Vajpeyi covered arbitration in both domestic and international contexts. He emphasized on key developments in International Commercial Arbitration and discussed how arbitration offers a faster, cost-effective alternative to litigation. Mr. Vajpeyi also explored investment arbitration and the role of artificial intelligence in arbitration proceedings, encouraging students to explore the growing significance of arbitration globally.

The last session was conducted by Mr. Sriram SL, who provided insights into the Indian Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023, explaining the roles and responsibilities of data fiduciaries and processors. He emphasised the importance of compliance with data protection laws, discussing the challenges that businesses face in protecting personal data. His session sparked interest in the evolving field of data privacy, encouraging students to consider this crucial area of law. This was followed by a high tea where the speakers enthusiastically engaged in one-on-one interactions with the students and provided clarity on any topics discussed in the sessions. Finally, the event moved towards an open house session where attendees posed their questions to Mr. Vajpayee and Mr. Sriram. The speakers guided the students through a verified range of topics with respect to their respective fields and provided career guidance, explaining the different career options that are available to law students. The event concluded on a high note, leaving participants not only equipped with invaluable knowledge but also inspired to carve their own paths in the ever-evolving landscape of corporate law, armed with insights that will shape their future endeavors.

In this Podcast series, Teams were required to propel compelling discussions and expert insights to elevate legal awareness, educate the public on their rights and available resources, and inspire proactive action in seeking legal help. This initiative strives to empower individuals with the knowledge and confidence to navigate the legal system effectively. The objective of conducting street plays/Jan Sunvaii was to tap into the creativity of youth in spreading essential Legal knowledge through artistic performance. This initiative aims to enhance legal literacy, empower citizens and foster a proactive approach to legal problems near the participating Teams.

The primary objective of the reel-making competition was to engage youth in raising awareness through the creative medium of reels, focusing on digital legal literacy, and sociolegal issues. This initiative aims to enhance legal literacy, empower citizens, and foster a proactive approach to legal problems in semi-urban and rural areas. The Litigation Assistance Lab was objectified to actively engage Teams in providing handson support for legal cases, focusing on practical litigation skills and real legal challenges. Teams have to work alongside the office of an Advocate or with an Advocate while contributing to Legal Aid matters. Collectively concluding with the submission of the Final Report incorporating all the parameters and deliverables accomplished during the competition. 
