About the Course

Through effective management, the chain of custody is maintained, guaranteeing the reliability of evidence throughout the investigative process.

Additionally, crime scene management extends beyond the physical aspects of a crime scene to encompass legal and ethical considerations. Professionals in this field must be well-versed in the laws governing evidence admissibility, ethical responsibilities in handling sensitive information, and collaboration with other criminal justice entities. By combining organizational skills, technical expertise, and legal knowledge, crime scene managers play a pivotal role in facilitating thorough investigations and ensuring that the criminal justice system operates with accuracy and integrity.
